Re: Landfill Decommission - Historic Waste Cells – Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program ICIP Funding

The Town of Duck Lake is pleased to announce funding through the Green Infrastructure Stream of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP). This funding will go towards the Landfill Decommissioning of Historic Waste Cells. The construction phase of the project amounted to \$501,641, with an investment of \$200,656 from the Federal Government, \$167,197 from the Provincial Government, and the remainder of the funding was contributed by the Town. The construction portion of the decommissioning is the second phase of the project, with the total cost for the project amounting to \$707,103.

“Landfill infrastructure is essential to strengthening rural Saskatchewan, and we commend Duck Lake for their dedicated efforts,” Minister of Government Relations Eric Schmalz said. “By decommissioning this landfill, the Town of Duck Lake is helping to protect our environment and improve its capacity to manage waste disposal for years to come.”

The project focuses on safely decommissioning legacy waste cells, helping to reduce environmental risks and improve long-term sustainability of the landfill site. This work supports the Town’s commitment to responsible waste management and environmental stewardship. The ICIP Program aims to develop sustainable infrastructure that fosters healthier, more environmentally friendly communities across Canada.
